Hello:

At our Annual meeting and in Southern Baptist life today there is a lot of talk about planting churches. Why? Why are we talking about planting new churches? Isn't it enough to have one church in each community?

There are a lot of reasons to plant new churches, but all of those reasons revolve around one overarching reason: we plant new churches in order to glorify God by spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ to more and more people.

But think about something else:

Some of our communities are frankly too large for one church to effectively minister to all of the people who live there. Remember that 90% of the people in our county are unchurched. A community of 3000, 4000, or 5000 people may not be effectively served by a church or 50, 75, or 100 active members. But a community of 20,000, 30,000, or 40,000 people will not be effectively served by one church with 100, 200, or 300 active members. 300 active members will not be able to effectively minister to and witness to 36,000 lost people. A new church is mandatory.

Different churches have different personalities and minister to different groups of people within a community. In Prescott Valley, for example, we have 3 Southern Baptist Churches. Each of the pastors and churches have different backgrounds, different personalities, and different ministry styles. Which one is best? None is better than the other; each is valuable in the God's work and each will reach a certain group of people in the community. Different churches reach more people.

There are a lot of other reasons that we plant new churches, but it all comes down to the need of more ministry units serving more and more people in Jesus' name.

Remember that the fields are ripe for the harvest.
